 3. Totals by State ignore DC in off-years. Turnout as % of Registration is adjusted to account for states without statewide registration.
 4. Cast/% US is the contribution to the National total of Votes Cast. Voting Age Pop. at the state level is estimated annually by the Census Bureau.
 5. The factor NCit90/%VAP is the estimated Non Citizens as % of the Voting Age Pop as of the 1990 census year. Note that this table will differ from the county-level tables.
