


DEMOGRAPHIC ABSTRACT FOR ___ CO. OHIO; TOWNSHIPS AND PLACES, 1990 CENSUS EDITION

Demographic information from the 1990 Census of Population and Housing for every county subdivision and place in the county. Includes information abstracted and enhanced from both the DEMOGRAPHIC GUIDE TO OHIO and the DEMOGRAPHIC ATLAS OF OHIO. The demographic profiles for each area, summarizing over 100 demographic factors, are compiled in one volume and printed in a larger font. Thematic equal interval maps are provided for seven representative factors and the base maps are reprinted from the Atlas. In addition, separate listings detail the hundreds of demographic factors for selective areas in the county. *A handy reference tool for any research into the demographics or politics of the any one county in the Buckeye State.*

⇒ Base maps include: regional overview map; state locator map; map of all county subdivisions; map of all places (incorporated and census designated); and an outline map of census tracts and block groups (with insets).



⇒ Thematic (shaded) equal interval maps illustrate the distribution of seven representative factors amongst all county subdivisions into three groups—those areas with the highest and lowest concentration and those in the middle.

⇒ Maps are included for each of the following factors: size by total population; % school age children; % minority population; % persons 18-64 in poverty; Socio-Economic Status (SES) indicators; % civilian unemployment (1989); % females in the work force.

⇒ A **special appendix** is included with the latest population estimates from the U.S. Bureau of the Census for each county subdivision and place—an equal interval map of county subdivisions is also part of the appendix

⇒ Census profiles summarize scores of demographic factors into a few dozen categories. Each factor includes the appropriate percentage calculation and an indicator of the comparison of the value for the subject area with the value for the state. The profiles are formatted to minimize cross-referencing to other sources. The concise format provides a demographic profile in one location. Complete profiles are included for every area in the county, even those which may have been abridged in the DEMOGRAPHIC GUIDE due to space limitations.

⇒ The profiles consist of five data paragraphs: 1) Geography, 2) Population Characteristics, 3) Income and Labor Force, 4) Housing and 5) Socio-Economic Indicators (SES).

⇒ An Appendix includes two analytical listings of data for selected areas in the county. 1) a Full Data Record listing enabling a detailed comparison of all demographic factors for the four selected areas; 2) a Comparative Scale Graph illustrating the relationship of all four areas. Selection criteria for the areas will vary upon the size of the county and the customer. Generally the selection would be for the two most populous county subdivisions (areas 1&2) compared with the data for the county (area 3) and the state (area 4).

Each page in the Abstract is a full-sized 8.5x11 inches and is provided in a three-ring binder to facilitate photocopying. Each Abstract includes about 60 pages, depending upon the number of areas in the subject county.

The ABSTRACT is designed to provide a readable demographic profile of basic information in a concise format for any one county. It is another POLIDATA demographic tool tailored specifically to OHIO. Not just another data report, but a ready source of demographic profiles and a volume with its entire analytical focus on one county in the BUCKEYE STATE.
